

Regular Meeting
Of the Town Board of the Town of Cuba

Held at the Cuba Library, 39 East Main Street, Cuba, NY

Supervisor Carney called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:00pm.

Public Comments: There are no comments at this time.

Approve Minutes of Previous Meeting 04/14/2015: McGraw motioned to accept the Minutes as presented. Scott seconded, all in agreement, motion passed.

Approve Supervisor's Report for April: The General Fund received \$21,123.95 and disbursed \$88,758.15 while the Highway Fund Received \$.00 and disbursed \$40,329.05. Scott motioned to accept the Supervisor's Report as presented, seconded by McGraw. All in favor, passed.

Approve General & Highway Abstracts for May: Nease motioned to approve the Abstract, McGraw seconded, all agreed, passed. The General Fund is \$39,675.95 The Highway Fund totaled \$40,727.17.

Board Comments: There are no comments at this time.

Clerk's Comments: Carpies submitted their letter of intent to renew their liquor license.

Police Department Comments: Cuba Police responded to 335 calls to service in April and developed 23cases from these. The Police Department handled 10 motor vehicle accidents, 2 in the Town, 4 in the Village, 1 on the Lake and 3 on I-86. There were 53 Traffic Stops conducted with 28 Traffic Summons issued, 5 in the Town, 13 in the Village, 8 on the Lake and 2 on I-86. The Police Department also handled 2 noise complaints, 6 motorist assists, 8 vehicle lock-outs, 2 parking tickets/complaints, 10 domestic disputes, and 7 other agency assists. The Police Department assisted the Ambulance on 13 calls. The Police Department conducted 2 safety car seat installations. Pill drop offs completed were 52, with 88 pounds of pills being taken off the streets along with 5 large sharps containers full of used needles. Business funds escorts totaled 31. Patrols checked Cuba businesses 32 times and properties of residents out of town 14 times. The K-9 Unit assisted Alfred Police Department with a bomb threat. There was no bomb found. Officers rode on the school buses during the morning and evening randomly in an effort to promote bus safety and build relationships with the children. Twenty free bike helmets were handed out thanks to the traffic safety grant. Safety signs for Craig's List transfers are installed in the parking lot at the station. Signs of direction to the PD are available. Training for the K-9's to track people is almost complete.

Ambulance Comments: Cuba Ambulance Service responded to a total of 31 calls to service in April. Of those calls 21 were taken to Olean General Hospital, 7 sign offs, and 3 stand by for fire. There were 9 Critical Care calls with Cuba taking 7 and Olean 10 taking 2.

Highway Department Comments:

Worked performed in April included the following services:

- Wrote 8-ton limit permits for Jackson Hill, Hammond Rd and Maple Lane
- Plowed snow once in April
- Finished sweeping roads, some twice
- Cut brush on prospect
- Received new pickup
- Took old trailer to auction and sold it for \$3,500

Equipment Repairs:

- Put new radiator in Mack
- Had new clutch installed in Sterling
- Painting plow equipment

Dog Control Officer Comments:

- 04/15/2015 Dog running at large by the library. Owner located and dog returned.
 04/17/2015 Complaint of dog not being taken care of properly. Owner notified of complaint and situation was resolve. Also notified dog must be licensed.
 04/17/2015 Resolved complaint of dog on neighbor's property.
 04/20/2015 Scheduled dangerous dog hearing after incident in village. Dog was quarantined.

Code Enforcement Comments:

- Fielded calls with code questions.
- Permit issued for 21' x 30' car port on Ramblewood Road
- Final inspection and C of O on manufactured home on Stowell Road
- Inspected home on Jackson Hill Road

Facilities Committee: Two air conditioning units have been ordered for the Town Hall.

Old Business:

New Town Hall: All is going well. Continuing to work with Insurance Company and contractor on insurance claim.

New Business:

National Grid Guywire: The cost to move the guywire is approximately \$741.

National Fuel: Usage will be estimated as to be able to convert service from the school to the Town.

Resolution for County Lead: Town of Cuba Resolution 05/2015 #1:

WHEREAS: The State of New York has passed Property Tax Freeze legislation and

WHEREAS: The State of New York is allowing each of its municipalities to file Tax Freeze documentation (Government Efficiency Plans and certifications) using their County as Lead Entity rather than filing individually and

WHEREAS: The State of New York will consider plans submitted to the Lead Entity as having fulfilled the municipality filing requirements under the Tax Freeze Legislation,

THEREFORE: The Town of Cuba hereby resolves to recognize our county as Lead Entity and submit our documentation to them rather than directly to the State.

So moved by Joseph Miller and seconded by Steven Nease.

Roll Call vote shows: McGraw, yea, Nease, yea, Carney, yea, Miller, yea, Scott, nay. Majority rules, resolution passed.

Lawn Care: Dave Fuller and Dave Fries will be contacted and asked to start mowing as soon as possible. The rates are the same as last year.

At 7:21 pm the meeting was adjourned with motion from Scott and second from McGraw. All in favor.
