



“Keep Cuba Village Beautiful”

Cuba Village is a hidden gem in the Southern Tier. To help it sparkle, the Village has launched a beautification drive.

- As each of us walk or drive, we may see soda cans, candy wrappers, cigarette butts, plastic cups, and animal droppings on village streets and sidewalks.
- Village Code § 125-2 states that “No person shall throw or deposit litter in or upon any street, sidewalk or other public place within the village except in public receptacles or in authorized private receptacles for collection.” To assist you in keeping our village clean, additional trash receptacles will soon be in place.
- Pet waste left to decay on sidewalks, lawns, or common areas is a problem. Studies have found that dog droppings are a leading source of E. coli bacterial pollution.
- Village Code § 76-20 states that “No person shall suffer, allow or permit any animal which such person owns or harbors, keeps, controls or otherwise maintains to soil, defecate or deposit any dropping or fecal matter on any public road, street, highway, sidewalk or area adjacent thereto or upon any public grounds or parks or any private property without the permission of the owner of said property, unless such person shall make a reasonable effort to immediately clean and remove such droppings and fecal matter in good faith and so as to prevent such soiling action, which soiling action is declared to be a public nuisance detrimental to public health.” A plastic bag works very well to pick up the droppings.

Working together, we should be able to keep our village streets and sidewalks cleaner and healthier.
