The Village of Cuba Board of Trustees held their monthly Board Meeting and Public Hearing on Local Law #1, 2013 and Local Law #2, 2013 on Monday, March 11, 2013 at 7:00 pm in the Village of Cuba Hall, 17 E. Main St.

PRESENT: Mayor Thomas Taylor, Trustees Michael Doyle, Andrew Swift and Judith Zayac. Trustee Patricia Petroni was excused.

ALSO PRESENT: Richard Hall, SPW, Diane Wilson, Clerk/Treasurer, Lon Sweet, Bob Clark, Olean Times Herald, Dustin Burch, Police Chief and Doug Rettig.

THE MAYOR OPEN THIS MEETING AND PUBLIC HEARING WITH THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND WELCOMED EVERYONE.

GUESTS: none to speak

Mayor Taylor read the two local laws presented for adoption tonight.

LOCAL LAW #1, 2013 is a law to amend Schedule XV: Handicapped Parking to change the handicap parking spot from 46 W. Main St. to the North side of W. Main Street in front of 45 W. Main St.

LOCAL LAW #2, 2013 is a law intended to control and restricts garage and yard sales in order to protect the public health, safety, welfare, and convenience of the village residents; and to restrict such sales and or occasional, occurrences in order to help maintain the character of residential neighborhoods. The intent of this Chapter is to eliminate repeated, perpetual, prolonged, and extended garage and yard sales in the Village of Cuba. Such sales, if continues, tend to or may become retail businesses subject to other regulation and, create a nuisance. The provisions of this Chapter arise from the need to limit and regulate garage and yard sales. It is not the intent of this Chapter to amend any other chapter of the Village Code.

The Mayor asked if there were any comments or questions. Mr. Rettig asked if there wasn't a garage sale law in the zoning law already. He was told there was not. Mr. Sweet asked if the small setups are affected by this law. Trustee Swift said that unfortunately yes. Knowing that there is a couple of places that always have a small sale quite regularly and this is unfortunate.

MINUTES: The Board was given copies of the minutes of 2-11-13 Board Meeting. With no amendments to these minutes a MOTION WAS MADE BY TRUSTEE JUDITH ZAYAC AND SECONDED BY TRUSTEE ANDREW SWIFT TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF 2-11-13. THESE WERE APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.

BILLS: The Board was given the Abstract of Vouchers 566-630 totaling \$89,355.75 prior to this meeting and Mayor Taylor reviewed them. The breakdown of these bills to be paid is as follows:

A MOTION WAS MADE BY TRUSTEE JUDITH ZAYAC AND SECONDED BY TRUSTEE MICHAEL DOYLE TO PAY THE BILLS TOTALING \$89,355.75. THIS PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

BUILDING INSP/CEO: Mr. Putt emailed his report to the Clerk and Board. No comments on this report at this time.

ANIMAL CONTROL: Mrs. Botens dropped off her report for the Board. There were no comments on her report.

WWTP: No report

PUBLIC WORKS: Superintendent Hall reported the following:

- Cold patching potholes
- Shoveling/salting walks and bridges as well as plowing and sanding streets as needed
- ➤ Hauled snow from C.F.D. and the parking area behind the bank
- ➤ Equipment repairs: changed both the trans. Filters on truck #9 (inline & sump), International dump inspected, services lawnmower (took to Sisson's for hydraulic pump work) and service street sweeper. Thanks to Dennis Myers and CRCS for the use of the old bus garage to do our work.
- > Read water meters
- > Water leak repair on North Branch Rd., small leak
- ➤ Still looking for a large water leak (read meters found a couple of small things will call NY Leak Detection.
- ➤ Installed a couple more new Meters, will have to do by appointment now.
- Cutting/splitting firewood for shop heat
- > Todd Fries cut trees behind WWTP for Lloyd's project and we went down to help cut smaller stuff.
- ➤ Continues with cleaning up behind the shop-hauled old concrete to the Town of Cuba for their use.
- ▶ Jeff Griswold back to work 3-5-13 and Paul Shaller returned on 3-7-13.
- ➤ Duane Hopkins was gone to Wastewater School from February 25th thru March 8th. (Lloyd informed Rick that Duane passed the first test)
- ➤ Leak detection came today about 2:00 pm and about 3:30 pm found the big leak on E. Main St. It did not surface; it went into the sewer system. Will be calling underground locate as an emergency and start working on it as soon as it is marked for underground lines. Leak detection was being paid for 8 hours, therefore they will continue to see if there anymore leaks.

➢ Five quotes were received for surveyors for the property at the landfill on Jackson Hill. They are from Lu Engineers \$2,900., B& R surveying \$3,280., James Brown \$1,000.-\$1,200., Mike Canada \$850. and Michael Roeske \$1,200. +500.00 for any extra. A MOTION WAS MADE BY TRUSTEE MICHAEL DOYLE AND SECONDED BY TRUSTEE JUDITH ZAYAC TO ACCEPT THE QUOTE FROM MIKE CANADA FOR \$850.00. THIS PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

POLICE REPORT: Chief Burch reported that the Cuba Police responded to 225 calls to service in February and developed 42 cases from these. The department handled 18 motor vehicles accidents of which 3 were in the Village. There were 33 traffic summons issued 10 in the Village. The police department also handled 10 motorist assists, 10 vehicle lock-outs, 3 parking tickets were issued on Main Street, 4 other agency assists. The Police department completed 1 pill drop and 2 gun locks were handed out to residents. The next Neighborhood Network Meeting is scheduled for March 13th, 2013 at 7:00pm at the A. Arnold Community Center. The Police Department would like to thank every resident and business owner that has sent donations for out K-9 Unit. The Police Department will hosting active school shooter training with the New York State Police at Cuba-Rushford Central School, we will be inviting other agencies to participate in this free training in an effort to establish uniformity in the face of school shooting threat. The date set for this training is April 3rd, 2013.

CLERK/TREASUER REPORT:

A MOTION WAS MADE BY TRUSTEE ANDREW SWIFT AND SECONDED BY TRUSTEE MICHAEL DOYLE TO PASS THIS RESOLUTION SETTING THE STANDARD WORK DAY FOR THE DEPUTY CLERK. THIS TOO PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

➤ The fire department asked that the open container law be lifted for Firemen's Park for the following events:

Trustee Swift stated that the fire department does not need to ask permission from this Board as in Chapter 73, Alcoholic Beverages in the Village Code Section 73-4 A states the exception.

Jan's Outdoor Supply was inspected and found to be in compliance. She and the Village Clerk felt that this certificate should also be on file in the Village Hall as they are located within the Village limits.
- At this time Clerk Wilson is asking for permission to contact Bond Counsel regarding the bonding of the Route 446 project at an estimate cost of \$380,000. She would like to get the paperwork going and Rural Development needs to know that the Village is going to fund this project to request \$150,000. of ARC funds towards the project. A MOTION WAS MADE BY TRUSTEE MICHAEL DOYLE AND SECONDED BY TRUSTEE ANDREW SWIFT GIVING THE CLERK/TREASURER PERMISSION TO CONTACT BOND COUNSEL TO GET THE PAPERWORK GOING FOR BONDING OF THIS PROJECT.
