***Do parents have to stay?** If your child is five or older AND you are confident he/she can behave unsupervised at the park, the answer is no. However, **REC IS NOT A BABYSITTING SERVICE.** We cannot keep children at the park nor keep track of where he or she goes. For full rules for participation, visit the village office.
